PMI Luxembourg Chapter celebrates its inauguration

Fifty of Luxembourg's project management community met at the Cat Club on Tuesday 15 June to mark the inauguration of the Luxembourg Chapter of the Project Management Institute, at an event sponsored by Sogeti, infeuropa and PricewaterhouseCoopers

Since its founding in 1969, the Project Management Institute (www.pmi.org) has grown to be the organisation of choice for project management professionalism. With nearly 500,000 members, credential holders, volunteers and trained project professionals worldwide in over 185 countries, PMI is the largest and leading non-profit professional association in the area of project management, dedicated to the development of the project management profession in all industry sectors.

PMI sets industry standards for project management, provides seminars and educational programs, conducts research and provides professional certification and exchange opportunities designed to strengthen and further establish the profession. The most commonly known products of PMI are the PMBOK project management standard and the Project Management Professional (PMP) certification. PMI members represent a range of industries, from IT and construction to automotive, aerospace and defence.

Around the world, local representation of PMI is provided by Chapters. The Luxembourg Chapter originated as a Section of the Belgium Chapter, which has lent its full support to the formation of the Luxembourg Chapter from the outset, including a generous donation of start up capital.

In his address, the President of the Chapter, Mr. Laurie Causton, underlined that the event was not only a celebration of the inauguration of the Chapter, but also a means to promote the ways in which the Chapter can engage with the project management community in Luxembourg, through support for the improvement of project management activity by the application of PMI standards and best practices, and through PMI's professional certifications. He also sought the support of the community in helping the Chapter realise its objectives through membership of the Chapter and by participating as volunteers in the work to develop the Chapter.
