








GHANA versus LUXEMBOURG


PMWB together with PMI Ghana decided to provide to the ACCRA authorities:

Typical workshop topics,

- 5. Diverting waterways and surface waters a city / Creation of sub-terrain sinks or home temporarily absorb excess of wateer before populated area's




Types of waste and damages










- ▶ 2 Topics

 - ▶ STEP B : WHAT can be done about it ?
 - ► STEP C: Describe ACTIVITIES and TIMING to get a working solution
 - ► STEP D : Produce ACTION PLAN

Poor Solid Waste Management

- Waste management systems are poorly implemented or non-existent in some areas
- Waste disposal causes blockages
- negative impact on water safety and quality
- official waste disposal sites are small and overloaded
- quality of services differs depending on income levels
- The system in place aggravates the flood risk in low-income neighborhood
- For some, the fee for waste disposal is a substantial amount of their income
- Awareness about improper waste disposal exists, but people still keep dumping illegally as there is no enforcement

Lack of Institutional Coordination

- Complex stakeholder landscape, where nobody wants to take the lead
- The present institutional system concerning urban drainage is malfunctioning
- shared responsibility in urban drainage (maintenance, construction, flood disasters, ...)
- The extreme division of responsibilities complicates coordination of planning and maintaining
- Four main stakeholders with direct responsibilities were identified:
 - Accra Metropolitan Assembly (AMA)
 - Ministry of Local Government and Rural Development (MLGRD)
 - Ministry of Roads and Highways (MRH) Department of Urban Roads (DUR)
 - Ministry of Water Resources, Works and Housing (MWRWH) -Hydrological Services Department (HSD)
- a need for coordination between the various parties
- A need for an integrated drainage master plan
- People are highly displeased with what they feel as lack of commitment of the institutions to improve the situation
